America at a Glance: Early Fears Realized as COVID-19 Surges in Rural Counties:

Examines the difference between the expected need for local COVID-19 ICU beds and the number of actual beds available between October 26 - November 8, 2020. In the News:

Dec 1, 2020 -- COVID-19 Takes a Holiday? Rural Infection Rate Drops During Thanksgiving Week: Analyzes new COVID-19 infection rates between November 22-28, 2020, finds that for the first time in 10 weeks, rural counties saw a decrease in the number of new infections, with a drop of eight percent from the previous week. Discusses how the Thanksgiving holiday could have impacted reporting, as more than a third of U.S. states altered their reporting schedule.

Nov 30, 2020 -- Primary Care Offices Struggling to Survive During COVID-19: Discusses how the COVID-19 pandemic has impacted primary care offices and summarizes a study that estimated 16,000 physician practices have closed under the stress of the pandemic, while many more struggle financially. Describes how rural areas are especially impacted, as they already lack an adequate number of healthcare providers.

Nov 27, 2020 -- <u>Rural Hospitals in Alabama Struggle to Find Enough Nurses to Face COVID-19</u>: Describes the challenges an administrator at Choctaw General Hospital faces while trying to recruit nurses in rural Alabama. Discusses how a shortage of nurses makes recruitment difficult,



but the COVID-19 pandemic creates additional challenges, as nurses are in high demand across the entire country and urban hospitals have the resources to pay higher salaries.
