**Benefits and Barriers to Pediatric Tele-Urology During the COVID-19 Pandemic:** Study of remote video visits by a pediatric urology provider serving rural Virginia that examines the rapid integration of video visits into a practice that previously treated patients exclusively in-person. Discusses patient demographics, diagnosis and clinical outcomes, and success rates of video visits for 116 patients. **The "Community of Immunity" Vaccination Deficit Explorer:** An interactive web-based mapping tool offering county-level estimates of annual influenza vaccination rates and potential COVID-19 vaccination deficit rates. Results can be filtered by the Community PPE (Public Health, Primary Care, Health Equity) Index, a measure of public health readiness to respond to the pandemic. **Multi-Discipline Licensure Resource Project:** Provides current information on emergency regulations and licensing for occupational and physical therapists, psychologists, and social workers. **Provider Bridge:** Connects healthcare professionals with state agencies and healthcare entities to increase access to care for patients in rural and underserved communities, and assists in mobilizing volunteer healthcare professionals during public health emergencies. **Reeve Foundation Quality of Life Grants:** Grants to nonprofit organizations that provide services to improve the daily lives of people with paralysis and their families. Jan 19, 2021 -- [Rural Death Toll Passes 60,000; New Infections Decline](#): Analyzes new COVID-19 infection rates between January 10-16, 2021, finds that new infections declined in rural counties, but the cumulative rural death toll surpassed 60,000. Includes county-level data identifying areas in the red zone with infections of 100 or more per 100,000 residents.

Jan 19, 2021 -- [Rural Vaccine Access Varies Widely, Sources Say](#): Explores COVID-19 vaccination distribution in rural areas across the country, describes how the lack of a database makes it difficult to track progress and identify areas that need help. While rural Texas hospitals struggle to get ahold of the vaccines, some rural areas in Washington are ahead of the curve and waiting for the rest of the state to catch up.

Jan 13, 2021 -- [Using Lessons from the Pandemic to Reimagine Health Care](#): Blog post discusses lessons learned and areas that transformed healthcare during the COVID-19 pandemic. Describes how partnerships between organizations and across other sectors bring innovation and collaboration, especially for rural providers with limited resources. Highlights opportunities within data analytics, the public health system, and virtual care.
