Strategic Legislative Strategy Meeting - we'll need some patience on GEMT while we work through it.

Two Talking Points—

- Systemic Funding rework the wording and massage—to show we support it but have some work to do.
- Apprenticeships, Training College Readiness—buzz word around the state house. Go Future Ready lowa Commission—we
 are signed on as an industry with a need to fill positions—should lead to some training funds and dollars for us.
- Other buckets of dollars for recruitment of providers.
- REPLICA—possible 3rd Talking Point

Mid-October – we should have final talking points.

Bureau of Emergency & Trauma Services Report - IDPH Rebecca Curtiss, Bureau Chief BETS

Opiod Grant came through – working on how to best use that money. Try to do more prevention and be sure folks know about the therapy and detox options out there.

RFP out EMS Flex Supplemental Grant—closing soon –We're using the EMS survey information we gathered about a year ago.

Three Areas of Focus for this grant--

- Infrastructure
- Volunteerism
- Billing

Finalizing the Data Dictionary—then we can take Chapter 132 in front of the Rules Committee—it's the national data set—only using the mandatory data elements that are required. Any reference to patient care report is out.

System Standards - Survey information 760 data elements—EMS folks looked at this and tried to come

Volunteerism—If I got 50 people on my service—only 25 show up for training—but only ½ of those actually go on a call. Lots of money in training and certifying those employees. Now they will have information on who is responding and can figure out what the best use of those training dollars is—from the non-transport side.

Billing – 12% of Transport Services don't bill. We need to start to get more involved in the reimbursement side of EMS. Because they are not billing – There is no way for Medicare and Medicaid—to know how many calls and how to allocate a proper Medicaid reimbursement rate for our state. Executive Board—will draft a letter to send out to all the services that explains WHY THEY NEED TO BILL. Let's build some infrastructure to reach out to neighboring services to share billing services.

Number of Calls – With 900+ Services in the state of lowa—how many calls are we doing. How many calls do you have to go on –and how can we find more efficiencies in the PCR's – instead use the volunteer time to get some skills training or something. 70% respond to less than 100 calls a year. How can we develop 28D's and 28E's to get – how can we be better stewards of our volunteer's time.

Simulation in Motion update—we were full steam ahead—proposals for orgs that can sustain it. We had lots of interest in getting but some have backed out—so we're now back to ground zero starting over. NWICC and University of Iowa are still in. But need two more facilities to take the other two.

- Financial Review Update Pittman bid in \$3500 estimate
- Desmond + Shaul Bid:
 - Start with drawing a line in the financial statements and using 1/1/18.
 - Recommend going back and ensuring that bank reconciliation is done monthly starting 1/1/18-rest of year.
 Estimated cost would be \$200/month for us to perform this. We would compare the bank and Quickbooks and ensure that all activity is included. Also, review the database activity to ensure the amounts agree to the deposits in the bank. Would also ensure that items are correctly coded during this process.
 - o Help ensure that the database is being properly synced to Quickbooks. Estimated cost for this would be \$500
 - Help ensure that bills.com is being properly synced to Quickbooks. Estimated cost for this would be \$500.
 - o Through the processes above, come up with internal control recommendations to improve the process. Included.
 - o If the board so chooses, we can perform the quarterly payroll reports each quarter. The fee for this would be \$250/quarter.

 - In general, would recommend IEMSA hold off on a review until the books are up to date to ensure the numbers are correct. If the board still wants to perform a review, I would recommend this be done on the 2018 year once the numbers are completed.
